The Power of God's Word By Don Krow

(Discipleship Lesson 7)

Read the entire lesson and then answer the questions that follow.

I used to think that demon possession was something that happened only in foreign countries such as India, Africa, etc.. That was, until the night I happened to visit a Baptist church in Dallas, Texas.

We were standing in the church singing from the song book, when suddenly a young girl about nineteen years of age fell on the floor and began to have what I thought was a seizure.

A medical doctor who attended that church told several of us to take the girl to a nearby house belonging to one of the church members, and there he would examine her. By the time the girl got to the house, her eyes were dilated and a masculine voice was speaking from her. Although this girl was a United States citizen and had never traveled outside of America, she was speaking in a foreign language that seemed to be German, and at other times English.

This unclean spirit, which the Bible also calls a demon or devil, immediately began to accuse me and say in a loud masculine voice, "You're going to Hell!" "No, I'm not!" I replied, and we argued that way for a while. It seemed this demon had authority and power over me, and I was not getting very far with it when suddenly I had an idea.

I turned in the New Testament to Philippians 2:6-11 and proceeded to read verses 10-11 out loud – "That at the name of Jesus every knee should bow, of things in heaven, and things in earth, and things under the earth; And that every tongue should confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father." Suddenly in a loud voice the demon screamed, "Shut up! Don't say that!" I thought to myself, "This is quite a reaction." So, again I began to read the scriptures out loud. "Stop that! I can't stand that!" the demon cried. So, again I read the scriptures. This time the demon in the girl began to make her hold her ears. I continued to read and this time the demon threw the girl on the floor and she began to bow before me at the Name of Jesus.

What should be our attitude toward the Bible?
5.	God's Word is like a seed (Luke 8:11 "Now the parable is this: The seed is the word of God.") It is to be planted in men's hearts. Some people: (underline one)

a. Read Luke 8:11-12. "Now the parable is this: The seed is the word of God. [12] Those by the way side are they that hear; then cometh the devil, and taketh away the word out of their hearts, lest they should believe and be saved," and John14:6. "Jesus saith unto him, I am the way, the truth, and the life: no man cometh unto the Father, but by me." Never come to believe Jesus' claims (that He is the only way to God).

- b. Read Luke 8:13. "They on the rock are they, which, when they hear, receive the word with joy; and these have no root, which for a while believe, and in time of temptation fall away." Believe for a while but when times get rough, they fall way.
- c. Read Mark 4:19, "And the cares of this world, and the deceitfulness of riches, and the lusts of other things entering in, choke the word, and it becometh unfruitful," and Luke 8:14. "And that which fell among thorns are they, which, when they have heard, go forth, and are choked with cares and riches and pleasures of this life, and bring no fruit to perfection." Investigate the claims of Jesus but other things take priority.
- d. Read Luke 8:15. "But that on the good ground are they, which in an honest and good heart, having heard the word, keep it, and bring forth fruit with patience."

 With an honest and good heart will follow Jesus Christ and will continue to do so.
- e. All of the above describe the various conditions of men's hearts.

6.	Read 1 Timothy 4:1. "Now the Spirit speaketh expressly, that in the latter times some shall depart from the faith, giving heed to seducing spirits, and doctrines of devils." The scripture teaches that some people in the last days will depart from the Christian faith because they listen to and
7.	Read Luke 13:10-11. "And he was teaching in one of the synagogues on the sabbath. [11] And, behold, there was a woman which had a spirit of infirmity eighteen years, and was bowed together, and could in no wise lift up herself." Jesus was teaching in a synagogue on the Sabbath. There He met a woman who was bent over for eighteen years and could not stand up straight. This condition was caused by a
8.	Read Luke 13:12-13. "And when Jesus saw her, he called her to him, and said unto her, Woman, thou art loosed from thine infirmity. [13] And he laid his hands on her: and immediately she was made straight, and glorified God." We see the power of the word of God (Jesus' words) demonstrated when He said, "Woman you are from (your) infirmity and immediately after He touched her she was made, (healed), and she (or praised) God."
9.	Read Mark 5:1-13. Verses 12-13 in the New American Standard Bible states: "The demons implored Him (Jesus), saying, 'Send us into the swine so that we may enter them.' Jesus gave them permission. And coming out, the unclean spirits entered the swine; and the herd rushed down the steep bank into the sea, about two thousand of them; and they were drowned in the sea." Demons are subject to the Word of God. The demons cried, 'Send us into the swine' and Jesus gave them p (vs.13).
10.	Read Ephesians 6:17. "And take the helmet of salvation, and the sword of the Spirit, which is the word of God." There is nothing more effective in spiritual warfare than God's Word when empowered by His Spirit. It is the only offensive weapon in a Christian's armor that can cut, harm and hurt the enemy (the devil). It is referred to as the

11.	When I read Philippians 2:6-11 to these demons, (referred to in the discipleship lesson), they went crazy. The reason is that Philippians 2:11 states every tongue should confess that Jesus Christ is Lord (Deity; Master; Ruler; King; Boss; and He who has the right to control), to the glory of God the Father.
